Pelvioplasty Surgery: What is it?

Consistent with our mission, it is our desire to bring Creighton Model FertilityCare™/NaProTECHNOLOGY to as many women and their families as possible. An important part of this approach includes reducing the chance for damaging scar tissue (pelvic adhesions) from forming. Pelvioplasty surgery involves an intricate knowledge of the ligaments, muscles, nerves, and connective tissues of the pelvis. It is most commonly performed following the removal of endometriosis and/or other pelvic pathology. Our goal as NaProTECHNOLOGY surgeons is not only to remove pelvic pathology, but to restore normal pelvic anatomy and function, as well as preventing unwanted adhesions and scar tissue formation following surgery.

Performing pelvioplasty surgery can add an additional 1 to 3 hours to your surgery and requires specialized skill and training to perform properly. Sadly, this service is not covered by your insurance company, causing it to be omitted by many surgeons at the time of removing pelvic pathology.
